

What Do We Have to Give?

When the three wise men came to visit Baby Jesus they brought the great gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. When we come to visit Jesus in our church, he asks us for our time, talent and/or treasure. St. Joe's is in need for some parishioners, especially those who have never donated any time or talent, to step up and bolster our Eucharistic Minister and Reader teams.

Through natural attrition, (i.e. moving out of the parish, aging or burning-out) our rosters are dwindling. If we don't build up our EM list for example, we will have to go to smaller teams, which would probably eliminate one of the cups of Precious Blood, and maybe both over a period of time. And if you think about it, being an Extra-ordinary Eucharistic Minister (priests and deacons are the Ordinary Eucharist Ministers) is not asking any more time of us.

Being an EM is more a change of location for eight to ten minutes,

from our pew to a position up front. We are already at Mass every week anyhow. The only real burden is being committed to a specific Mass, approximately once a month. Getting to Mass a few minutes early and maybe staying a few minutes after to clean vessels is also requested of EMs.

In order to build up our teams and to answer any questions current EMs may have, we are holding a special EM meeting Thursday night November 13th. It will start at about 6:30, right after the newly-instituted monthly Thursday evening Mass dedicated to prayer for all the souls in Purgatory. We are also looking for all those who take the Eucharist to the home-bound to attend.

We need to know who is taking each and every host out of church and to whom they are taking the Eucharist. We have a real concern that there are several people who are taking the Eucharist to a loved one, but are neither listed on our home-bound minster list nor following our set guidelines for home-bound ministry. This includes our Hazel Finley EMs.

We have ministry needs at other positions as well. We have a newly-

trained set of altar servers, but we could use some of our former servers who are now in middle school to help by assisting with these new servers for the rest of the school year. Parents, if you have one of those servers in your family, please encourage him or her to help us out. Also, getting readers is a difficult task because of our natural fear of speaking to large groups. But we ask you to pray to the Holy Spirit for the gift of courage and help us out there. If so inclined, contact the parish office or me at the email address at the end of the column.

Once again I would appeal to those who have not donated time or talent to the parish in the past, (especially younger adults) to step up and help – then prepare yourselves for the Lord's blessings.

What is the Diocesan Catholic Social Teaching Collection?

This annual collection was established to equip the faithful to understand and put into practice Catholic teaching in light of the challenges of important social issues including the sanctity of human life, the dignity of the person, religious liberty, marriage and family, poverty, solidarity, and care for creation, Bishop Boyea has inaugurated a diocesan collection that will support small grants to applying parishes and Catholic entities within the Diocese of Lansing. This grant is designed to fund programs that combine catechesis with hands-on endeavors to advance Catholic social teaching within the diocese. Grant recipients will be selected by the Diocesan Commission on Catholic Social Teaching. We ask you to prayerfully consider contributing to this collection.

A Message from Phillip Campbell:

Thank you for the wonderful turn out at the talk Thursday night. There was a lot of interest in the Plenary Indulgence for praying in a cemetery during the week of Nov 1-8, and many questions about what cemeteries qualified. I checked the *Enchiridion of Indulgences*, the Church's official text on the subject, and actually it does not specify that the cemetery must be Catholic. The Church certainly seems to envision this prayer taking place in a Catholic cemetery, and this is encouraged, but strictly speaking, you can gain the indulgence by praying in any cemetery. Also, it is possible to obtain the indulgence more than once if all the conditions are met.

Plenary Indulgences for the Holy Souls Checklist, limit of one plenary indulgence per day:

- Be in a state of grace when the indulgenced work is completed (no unconfessed mortal sins).
- Have a disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin, at the time the indulgenced work is completed.
- Complete the indulgenced work of visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead once per plenary indulgence sought during the dates of November 1-8; OR
- Complete the indulgenced work of visiting a Catholic Church on All Souls' Day (November 2) and recite one
 Our Father and one Creed.
- Receive Holy Communion, once per plenary indulgence sought. (Preferably on the same day, but within 20 days).
- Pray for the Supreme Pontiff's intentions, once per plenary indulgence sought. An Our Father, Hail Mary, and Creed are suggested. (Preferably on the same day, but within 20 days).
- Go to sacramental Confession (within 20 days); one confession can suffice for several plenary indulgences.

Good news: A partial indulgence is available on behalf of the holy souls for visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead on every other day of the year.

Parents Seeking Sacraments for Children:

If you are seeking a sacrament for yourself or your child, please make sure you are first an active participating member of the parish. That means that you are formally registered and participating in the life of the parish, especially participating in community worship through weekly attendance at Weekend Masses. When you are here for Mass, it is important that you place your contribution envelope in the collection, *even if it is empty.* There is no way I can possibly know how often, or even if a person is attending Mass otherwise. Extra envelopes are available in the back of church in case you forgot to bring yours with you. So, please use your envelopes by placing them in the collection each time you come to Mass. This will allow me to verify a person's Mass attendance quickly and easily when they present themselves (or their children) for Baptism, First Eucharist, Confirmation, Godparents and Confirmation sponsors, or Marriage. When it comes to this policy you should know, multiple envelopes put in at a weekend Mass will be considered participation for that one Mass. Additionally, envelopes dropped off or mailed into the parish will not be considered participation at Mass. Thank you in advance for your cooperation on this matter.


