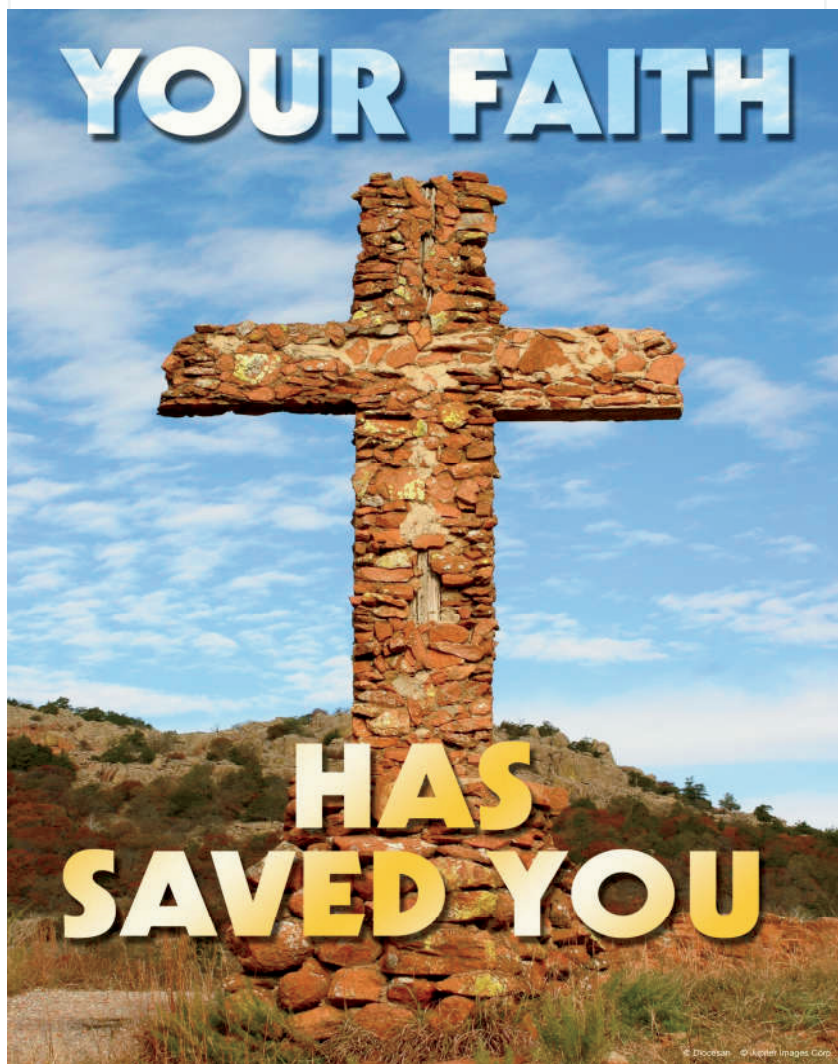

Let's Work Those Beads

What's with those beads Catholics use while praying? is a question many people outside of the Catholic universe ask. St. John Henry Newman had this response when asked about the rosary:

"The great power of the rosary lies in this, that it makes the Creed into a prayer. Of course, the Creed is in some sense a prayer and a great homage to God; but the Rosary gives us the great truths of (Christ's) life and death to meditate upon and brings them nearer to our hearts."

October is the "Month of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary." We just celebrated this week the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (formerly Our Lady of Victory) to celebrate the defeat of the naval forces of the Ottoman Empire in 1571. A Catholic coalition of ships was able to turn back the Ottoman's ships and put a halt to the Ottoman rule of the Mediterranean.

The men on the Holy League ships prayed the rosary the night before the battle, while churches throughout the Papal States were reportedly filled as they all prayed the rosary for Mary's intercession. Pope Pius declared after the battle that it was Our Lady's intercession that brought them this victory --Hence the battle's moniker "The Miracle at Lepanto."

The rosary is a great prayer of intercession that should be prayed slowly to allow meditation on the various mysteries and truths of Christ's life, as St. John Henry indicates. The mysteries are chronological within themselves from the first Joyful Mystery of the Annunciation (Angel Gabriel's visit to the Virgin Mary announcing God's plans for her as the Mother of Jesus,) through the joys and sorrows of her life and concluding with her coronation as Queen of Heaven and Earth – the last of the Glorious Mysteries.

Catholic scholar Scott Hahn has an interesting take on the rosary, for those who think recitation of the numerous Hail Mary's is tedious. Hahn points out that praying the Rosary allows the faithful to say "Blessed are you among women" at least 50 times, fulfilling Mary's prophecy in her Magnificat that "all generations

will call me blessed."

Hahn adds that the Rosary is also a special form of prayer because "it engages the whole person." Those who pray the Rosary can use their speech to form the words and their hearing to listen to the prayer's meaning, and tracking the prayers on Rosary beads gives their sense of touch a chance to become involved. He reminds us that meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary also engages our hearts and the minds.

Pope Leo XIV has called for Catholics to pray the rosary for peace every day through the month of October. We are all aware that our world is full of war and violence, so, even though we are a third of the way through October, let's heed the pope's request because it's never too late to pray for peace.

The Healing Mass is intended to bring solace to those who might be struggling with a medical condition, their faith, a troubled relationship, a personal loss, or any other personal issues. There will be an opportunity for a limited number of anointing's by Father Mike.

The Church's Rite of Anointing restricts the reception of this sacrament to those who, because they are elderly or because of illness, are in grave danger. They do not have to be dying, but their condition should be supposed serious.

Respect Life Month

October is Respect Life Month. This month is set aside for deeper prayer and reflections on the value of human life from conception to natural death. The theme for 2025 Respect Life month is **Life: Our Sign of Hope** to go along with the theme of hope for the jubilee year. There are several events that can help with our prayers for life. The 40 Days for Life is a prayerful and peaceful vigil which runs from September 24 to November 2, 2025. It is held outside abortion sites to pray for those who are faced with a choice in an unplanned pregnancy. Our vigil is outside Planned Parenthood in the Frandor Center.

There will be a pac 'n play in the gathering space to collect baby needs to support Shared Pregnancy. Share Pregnancy provides support and assistance to mothers who choose life. You will also see the white crosses outside church which gives a visual for the babies lost to abortion. This visual is a reminder to pray for these mothers who made this choice and to also remember those mothers who still feel they must make a choice--we pray that they choose life. I pray at the 40 Days for Life vigil site every Thursday at 2:00 p.m. You are welcome to join me or go to the website to sign up for another time. Remember that prayers are desperately needed to end the scourge of abortion in our world.

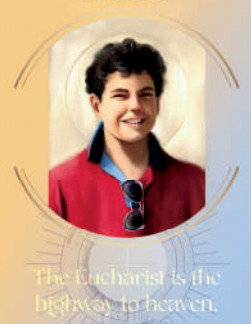
