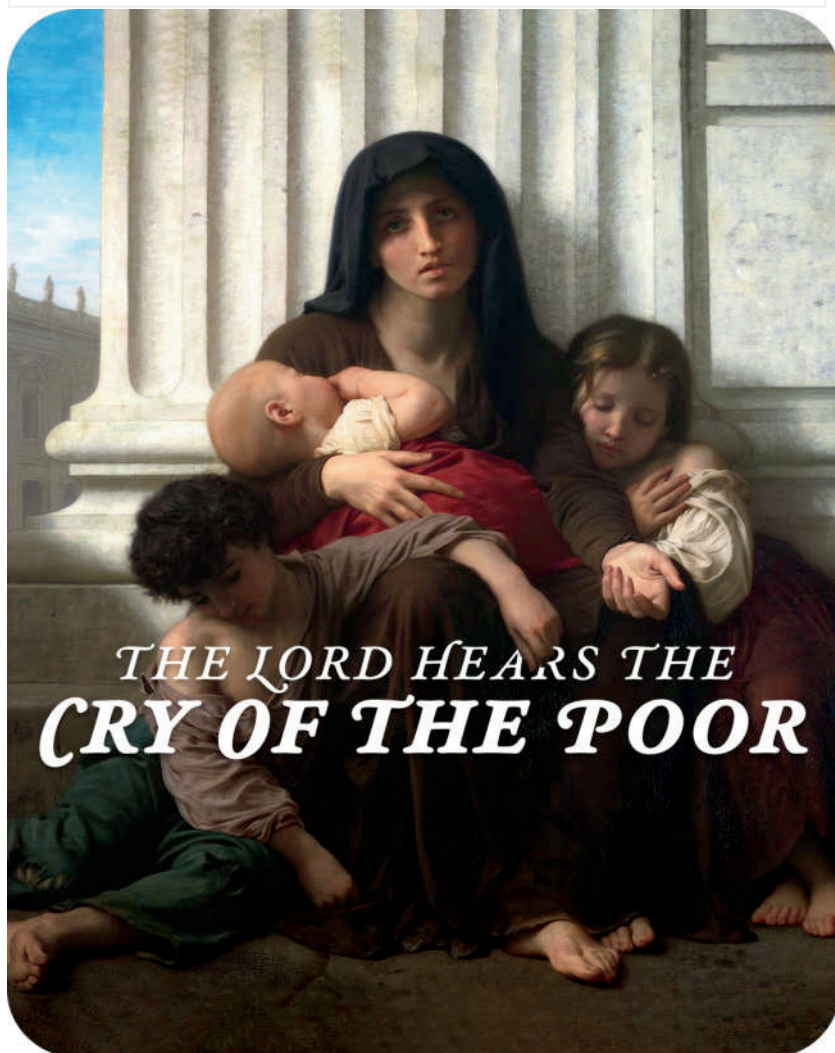

COLORS

Kodachrome

*They give us those nice bright colors
Give us the greens of summers
Makes you think all the world's a
sunny day, oh yeah
I got a Nikon camera
I love to take a photograph
So mama, don't take my Koda-
chrome away. – Paul Simon 1973*

It was certainly a Kodachrome week for my wife and I as we celebrated our 45th wedding anniversary cruising to and through the Upper Peninsula. With a bright golden sun, highlighting a Blessed Mother- blue sky almost every day, we first traveled through Petoskey, Harbor Springs, and the Tunnel of Trees-teased by hints of color in the trees just beginning to show their autumn hues. But who's complaining when one comes out of the tunnel to a meal at the iconic Leggs Inn, famous for its Polish cuisine.

The overall purpose of the trip, of course, was to enjoy the fall colors along the way to a couple destina-

tions of personal importance. Along the way, I reflected on the idea of "color." What would our lives be like without color? Would we bother putting a thousand miles on our cars primarily to look at gray leaves? I have said thank you to God for a plethora of gifts, but I don't remember before last week of ever saying "thanks" to the Lord for the gift of color—even more thankful knowing one in twelve men have some sort of colorblindness keeping them from seeing every color in its purest form.

So, as we drove along US-2 from St. Ignace to Manistique, I thanked the Lord for granting me the ability to enjoy the greenish-blue of Lake Michigan on my left and wall of red and yellow leaves on my right. I gained greater appreciation for God's paintbrush as the week went along. In looking down through the glass bottom boat at both the brown trout and the multi-colored rainbow trout at the Big Spring (Kitch-iti-kiki), I marveled at God's creation.

An appreciation of the gift of color was only enhanced by our visit to St. Peter's Cathedral in Marquette; the explosion of color surrounding Munising; the Pictured Rocks along the Lake Superior shoreline and Tahquamenon Falls. We are blessed to

live in such a beautiful, colorful state.

The creation of the film process known as Kodachrome some 90 years ago created a color revolution in the photography and cinematic world. The rise of digital photography led Kodak to retire its Kodachrome film in 2010. But it changed the world to some degree, with its ability to produce vibrant natural colors with sharp contrast.

Ironically, Paul Simon's hit song "Kodachrome" was about looking back at the black and white memories of life through rose-colored glasses. But that's all right by me because I have a new batch of moments to remember. "Mama don't take my Kodachrome away."
