

WE ARE ALL EVANGELIZERS

(AND WHATEVER ELSE IS ON DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

Now More Than Ever
How long, O Lord? I cry for help
but you do not listen!
I cry out to you "Violence!"
but you do not intervene.

These words in the first reading at Mass today were written about 25 hundred years ago, but they mirror the thoughts of possibly millions of people today as we process another violent act against innocent people targeted because of their faith. The words from the prophet Habakkuk show the frustration of a man of faith wondering where God is as the world seems to be crumbling when one act of evil follows another.

After hearing St. Paul's call last Sunday for faith, love, patience and gentleness many of us walked out of Mass and started to learn of the latest act of public evil only a hundred miles or so from us. A man, allegedly full of hate for Mormons, drove his truck into the Mormon church in Grand Blanc started shooting at the church-goers and then set the building on fire. Five people were killed.

This follows closely on the heels of the assassination of a political activist (an avowed Christian) and the killing of two children in a Minnesota church who were attending a school Mass. Taken together we can understand the anguish of Habakkuk: "O Lord I cry for help...but you do not intervene." The prophet's words were written as he watched evil thrive within the house of kings of Judah, just before the Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem, including its sacred Temple.

We don't have to watch a great city like Jerusalem fall to know something is wrong with our moral compass in this world. "All it takes for evil to thrive is for good men to do nothing" is a saying attributed to the 18th century British statesman Edmund Burke. It remains true today.

As I mentioned a couple weeks ago, what we need is a change of heart when it comes to the basic human right of life. When there are significant tragedies such as those mentioned, almost everyone is appalled and condemns the action. But as the crosses in our yard indicate, this is Respect Life month and though it's a call to a change of heart for those who support abortion, it's a reminder that the Catholic Church teaches protection for all life, from conception until natural death.

We can do that through prayer, and an opportunity for serious prayer is coming up this
Wednesday when we will have
Eucharistic Adoration from Noon until 7:00 pm. At the top of each hour, we will say a rosary for conversion as part of the nation-wide Rosary Congress. And may we all pray for more respect for ALL life throughout our country. Let's not be counted among the men and women who do nothing as evil thrives.


Our weekly average since July 1, 2025 is \$21,019.93. If we continue to keep this average, we will meet our budgeted goal.

Respect Life Sunday

Today is Respect Life Sunday which begins Respect Life Month. This month is set aside for deeper prayer and reflections on the value of human life from conception to natural death. The theme for 2025 Respect Life month is *Life: Our Sign of Hope* to go along with the theme of hope for the jubilee year. There are several events that can help with our prayers for life. The 40 Days for Life is a prayerful and peaceful vigil which runs from September 24 to November 2, 2025. It is held outside abortion sites to pray for those who are faced with a choice in an unplanned pregnancy. Our vigil is outside Planned Parenthood in Frandor Center.

There will be a pac 'n play in the gathering space to collect baby needs to support Shared Pregnancy. Share Pregnancy provides support and assistance to mothers who choose life. You will also see the white crosses outside church which gives a visual for the babies lost to abortion. This visual is a reminder to pray for these mothers who made this choice and to also remember those mothers who still feel they must make a choice--we pray that they choose life. I pray at the 40 Days for Life vigil site every Thursday at 2:00 p.m. You are welcome to join me or go to the website to sign up for another time. 
