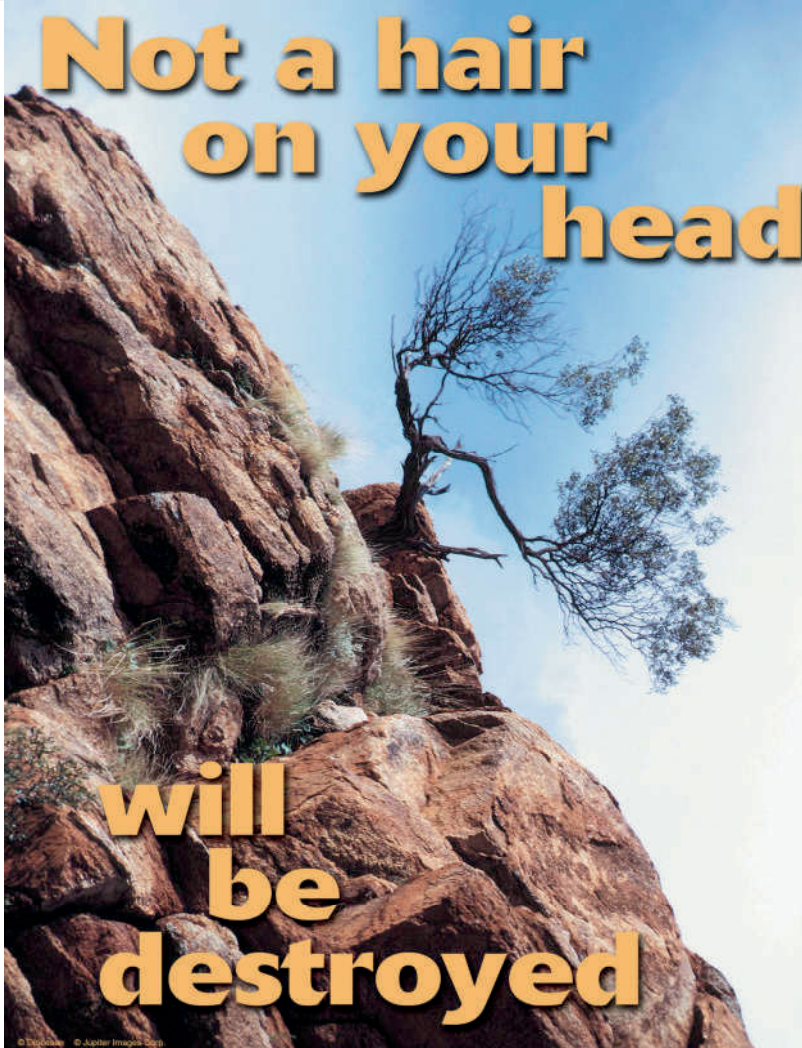

Help for Thanksgiving

The Clinton Community Thanksgiving Celebration and Dinner will again take place this year at St. Johns Lutheran Church, but as usual, we can use some help, both in the days prior to the event and Thanksgiving Day itself. My wife and I have been on the committee for the celebration and the event keeps getting bigger each year – we'll probably feed 400 or more people. Consequently, we need a great deal of help in preparing the food from Monday on.

We have a well-coordinated system that has been developed by our chef over the last six years, but we need to plug in bodies along the way to make food prep a simple process. We're asking people to sign up on our Sign-Up Genius which can be accessed through our website ccthanksgiving.org. All we ask of our volunteers is a two-hour shift on any day from Monday through Thursday, and you get to choose the task, the time and the day.

Assignments on Monday will be making squash and deboning turkeys. Tuesday shifts include making green bean casserole, making stuffing and deboning turkeys. Wednesday, you can choose from

deboning turkeys and washing dishes at the end of the day. All this prep on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday will take place at the Columbian Hall. Thursday, we need people at the hall to boil and mash potatoes, to wash utensils, warm corn and be a food runner to the Lutheran Church, where there are several kitchen and serving duties to be filled.

We all know we have much for which to be thankful to God – in this community and in this nation. Even if we have had a difficult year, this is an opportunity for us to remember what we have been given by the Lord and give a little back to the community. And after we work (or before) we invite all to join in the dinner and celebration. We want everyone to feel welcome, for Moms to take a day off from cooking, for families to eat together, for kids to play in our kids corner and for football fans to finally see a Detroit Lions Thanksgiving Day victory (they don't come very often). This is for everybody.

At this point, I would ask everyone to look ahead and see if they may be able to serve on the committee that runs this event every year. The current committee is dissolving after this year's event.

As much as it pains us to think that way after we've built this efficient dinner and celebration up, growing, even after pushing through the COVID pandemic. Our chef has to step away to care for his wife who has been diagnosed with a debilitat-

ing disease. His wife, our treasurer, is also leaving. Our chairman is moving out of the area. Current members will help train, but without new volunteers to step up this could be the end of this wonderful event.

Time is a precious commodity, especially around the holidays. Let's start the Christmas season early by giving some time to our community, for as we hear in the great Prayer of St. Francis: "It is in giving that we receive and in dying that we are born to eternal life."

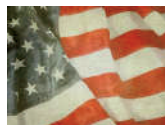

- We can start a sacramental record for you.
- Finally, registering can also help you have a greater sense of belonging to and ownership of the parish.

Please note:

The **envelopes** you receive when registering **will now play an important role in the reception of the sacraments.** (i.e. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation and Marriage) in the parish. *This also includes Confirmation Sponsors and Godparent selection.* We're asking all parishioners to get into the habit of using your envelopes in the weekly collection. Even if you give online or don't have anything to put in the envelope, please submit an envelope. It will help us know how many registered parishioners attend a given Mass and it will also come in handing for determining if a person, presenting themselves for a sacrament, is attending Mass regularly as is required.

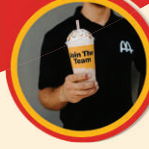
