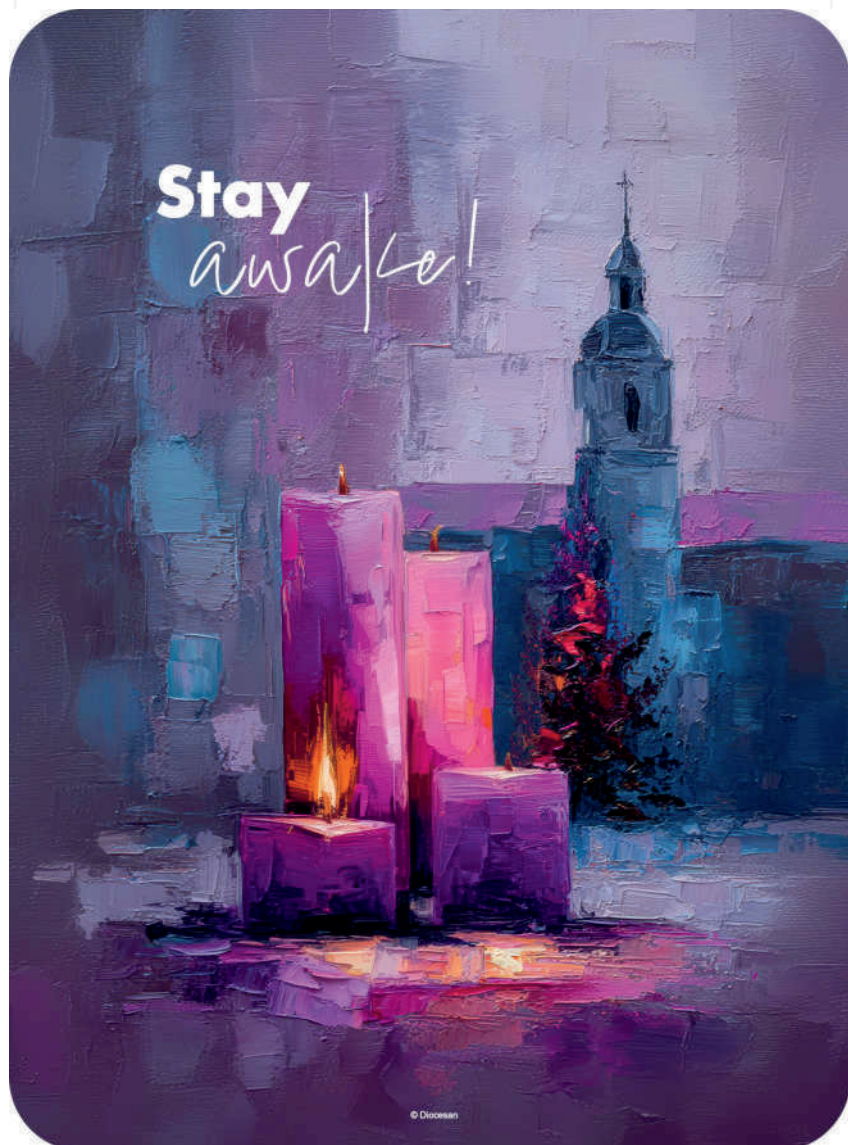

WE ARE ALL EVANGELIZERS

(AND WHATEVER ELSE IS ON
DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

When we were youngsters, we were told to look both ways before we crossed the street. When we were teenagers learning to drive we were told to look both ways before turning on to a new street. And when we reach the first Sunday in Advent, our readings tell us to look back and to look forward - to where we have been and to where we are headed.

With the almost-forgotten holiday known as Thanksgiving and the retail-driven holiday that it spawned, Black Friday, now behind us, the secular world has its sights set on Christmas (Or perhaps more accurately stated - Christmas sales figures). But on this first day of

the new liturgical year, Matthew's gospel reading from today looks back at Noah and the Great Flood, so we may better prepared for the Second Coming of Jesus.

Actually we have heard some warnings in recent Sunday gospels, helping us to focus on our interior lives because, as Jesus says today "at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." It is incumbent on us to be prepared, as Noah was, because if there are two of us standing in a field, Jesus warns "one will be taken and one will be left." And next week we will get a similar message from John the Baptist to "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

These first couple of weeks of Advent, the church reminds us of the need to look

inside ourselves and to cleanse our souls. The best way for us to prepare ourselves for Christmas is to go to Reconciliation this month. Though this is an extremely busy month for many people, if we put our spiritual needs at the top of our "to do" list, we will relieve anxiety and be better able to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Be prepared.


