



Waiting is Hard, But Worthwhile

We've talked about repentance as a key part of Advent – God wants us to repent, which includes not only asking his forgiveness for our sins, but also to turn away from sin and toward God. A second aspect of Advent that often gets overlooked is "waiting."

Our second reading at Mass today from the Letter of James, tackles that subject and its' relevance to developing patience. Patience is a fruit of the Holy Spirit and goes a long way toward developing endurance and prudence, as well as a stopgap for anger. With regard to Advent, we need patience to await the coming of the Lord on Christmas. James' letter not only tackles patient waiting, but includes an element of diligence as well.

To illustrate diligence in our waiting for the Second Coming of Jesus, James uses an example that many of us can appreciate with this being a rural community. He writes of a farmer waiting for crops to grow, knowing that it takes time for

seeds to germinate, grow and ripen in accord with the seasons – patiently awaiting the early and late rains in a growing season. Be patient, he says, because "Behold the Judge is standing before the gates."

In our world, everybody is in a hurry. Waiting is hard because we are always anxious to get to the end. Intellectually, we know that we can't plant seeds one day and harvest corn on the next day. In his homily last week Father Mike Schmitz broke down waiting in line into four categories: Unoccupied time, uncertain wait times, unexplained waits and unfair waits.

Occupied time, thus, feels shorter than unoccupied time – we hate waiting in line without doing anything. Uncertain waits, seem longer than known waits. Unexplained waits seem longer than explained waits (I want to know why). Unfair waits seem longer that perceived "fair" waits. (Hey, I was here before him). In sum, we want to know why we are waiting and when the wait will be over.

In our Average Joes get-together last week we used Fr. Schmitz's homily as the starting point on a discussion of dealing with waits and the need to not let them control us. It's really harder now to wait because we live in a right now culture. We used to have to wait for a newspaper to come out, or at least to the evening news to learn details of a big story. Now we just whip out our phones and check out the details in a matter of seconds.

When it comes to special days like Christmas, we have trouble enjoying the four-week journey to the celebration of Our Lord's birth. We want to jump to it. We are still eleven days away from Christmas and many of us have already been to a couple Christmas parties – we have trouble patiently waiting to celebrate with family and friends. We feel the need to be there, without appreciating the journey. So let's hit the brakes and patiently enjoy the ride.

Plenary Indulgence

As we come to the end of the Jubilee Year of Hope, this is a gentle reminder of the special graces available to the faithful through the Jubilee Indulgence. There are multiple ways to receive the indulgence, but they must be completed by January 6, 2026 (the Cathedral Plenary Indulgence lasts only through December 28, 2025)


To obtain an indulgence, the usual conditions of detachment from all sin, sacramental confession, holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope must be met, in addition to completing the indulgenced work, as a sign of your deep desire for true conversion and hope in God's goodness:

- Perform an extraordinary work of mercy such as a generous gift to the poor, or visiting nursing homes or prisons.
- Fasting for a day from "futile distractions" such as social media, television video games, and certain phone use.
- Make a brief pilgrimage to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Lansing. While there, participate in the Holy Mass, a celebration of the Word of God, Liturgy of the Hours, Way of the Cross, Rosary, or a penitential celebration that ends in the individual confessions.

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once per day, and may be applied either to oneself or a soul in purgatory.




