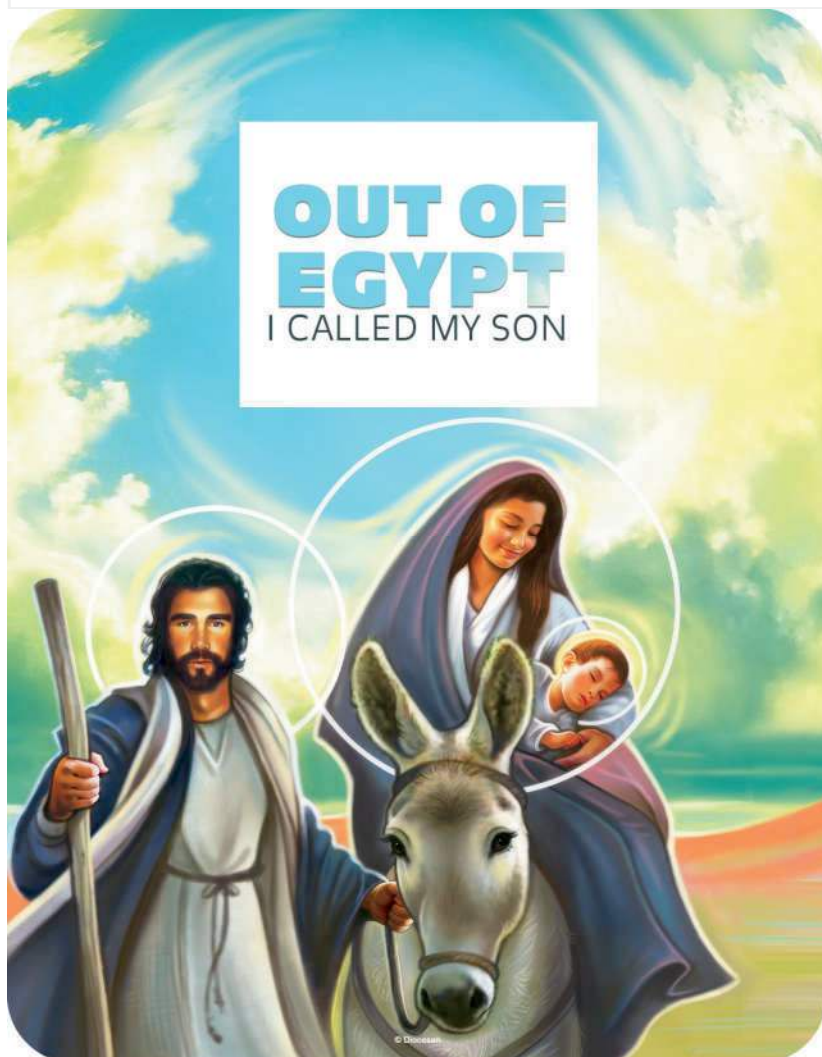

Striving for the Ideal

Today we celebrate the Holy Family, with Matthew's gospel taking last week's call to obedience to heart, heeding the angel of the Lord's words twice more—first taking Jesus and Mary to Egypt, then later sending them on to Nazareth to settle down. This gospel selection highlights not only obedience, but the parental desire to protect our children. Both migrations were anticipated in the Old Testament.

And it's in the Old Testament I would like to center our thoughts today. Our first reading from the book of Sirach paints a picture of the ideal family and touches on many of the attributes that are still important for families today. Sirach is also known as "Ecclesiasticus" or "The Wisdom of Ben Sira." (Why have only one name, when you can have three, right?).

Sirach focuses on friendship, education, poverty and wealth, laws, religious and social customs of the times, and is considered among the

Scriptural books of Wisdom by Catholics. However, it is one of seven books Protestants do not include since the Reformation.

In looking at today's selection, we get a glimpse of what God wants to see from families, how he wants family members to act toward each other. Sirach gives us something of a primer on family relationships. It presents fatherhood as something to be honored, but with that role comes responsibility. For example, the father is expected to pray so he can be heard that his sons may follow in his footsteps should they become fathers in later years, saying:

"Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children...whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother."

Sirach goes on to instruct children to take care of their parents in old age: "Even if his mind fail be considerate of him. Kindness to a father will not be forgotten (by God)." In presenting these words of wisdom, Sirach looks at more than the social aspects of the family structure, but shows how it is a fundamental theological reality.

Sirach aligns the family with core theological concepts like righteousness, the proper life, forgiveness and salvation. And what is obvious, yet not specifically stated, today's selection from Sirach reminds its Jewish readers to follow God's mandate to honor their fathers and mothers as given to them in both the books of Exodus and Deuteronomy.

Certainly, society has changed. It is not as patriarchal as in Jewish society prior to Jesus' birth, and we have more broken homes today. But the bottom line that we must show respect to our parents and our children is standard across all ages. So let's remember to show basic human dignity to all in our family. In doing so, we please God who created the family.

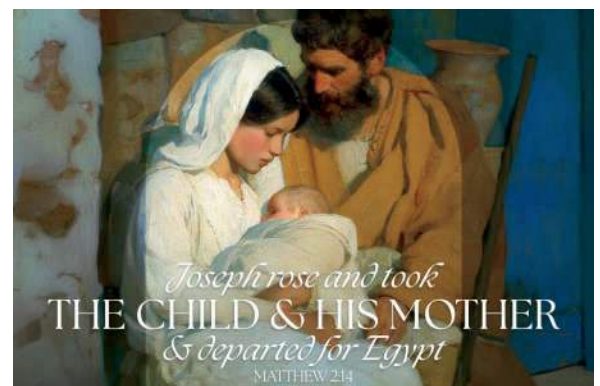
