



WE ARE ALL EVANGELIZERS

(AND WHATEVER ELSE IS ON DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

Obedience

On this last Sunday of Advent, the Church asks us to turn from the call to repentance as we've done for the last three weeks, and to look to obedience. And if you're looking for role models for obedience, you need look no further than St. Joseph and Our Blessed Mother. Mary's "Yes" to the Angel Gabriel set in motion a series of events unprecedented in history.

Joseph, a carpenter from Nazareth two thousand years ago, simply accepted the Angel of the Lord's proposal, as we heard in today's gospel from Matthew. No back-and-forth dialogue between heaven and earth like we heard from the likes of Zechariah, Abraham and Jonah. Just a non-verbal "Yes."

It sounds simple, but it certainly was not. The angel in today's gospel did not make a simple request of Joseph - - but rather a request that he alter his life in a way that changed salvation history. Remember, he was just an ordinary guy

betrothed to a woman named Mary.
But he had just discovered that she was with child through the Holy Spirit. Torn between the law of Moses, and his own compassion for her well being, he planned to divorce her quietly.

After all, the Jews were tied to the letter of the law of Moses and its 613 precepts. Jesus' ministry, in a nutshell, was rooted in two commandments: love God and love thy neighbor. But his ministry is a topic for another time.

Today's focus is Joseph, who despite his intention to divorce Mary, said "Yes" to both of the angel's two requests—to take Mary quietly into his home as his wife (being betrothed they were considered married) and to name the child Jesus. The right to name children, by the way, was typically the responsibility of the Father in first century Judaism.

It's important for all of us to note that Joseph's willingness to change his whole life in obeying the Lord's wishes—then contrast it with our maybe/maybe not attitude of obeying Church doctrine. We too often look at the world only from our point of view, instead of the view of the Lord. On the hot topic social is-

sues of the day, Catholics believe in, and vote for, these issues at the same rate as the general population.

As Christians, we know we have to make difficult ethical and moral decisions throughout our lives. We need to always allow love to guide us, the way it led Joseph. It was not "me first" but "God first" for him In making his love-based decision to say "Yes."

Christmas is a season of giving, when we focus on others more than ourselves. Let's pray in this last week of Advent, to not only vow to maintain focus on being other-oriented, but to listen closely for God's direction. He won't be asking us to take the Mother of God into our home, but he will remind us that we need to obey the two great commandments to love God with all we have and to love our neighbor as ourselves, just by saying "Yes."

Plenary Indulgence

As we come to the end of the Jubilee Year of Hope, this is a gentle reminder of the special graces available to the faithful through the Jubilee Indulgence. There are multiple ways to receive the indulgence, but they must be completed by January 6, 2026 (the Cathedral Plenary Indulgence lasts only through December 28, 2025)

To obtain an indulgence, the usual conditions of detachment from all sin, sacramental confession, holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope must be met, in addition to completing the indulgenced work, as a sign of your deep desire for true conversion and hope in God's goodness:

- Perform an extraordinary work of mercy such as a generous gift to the poor, or visiting nursing homes or prisons.
- Fasting for a day from "futile distractions" such as social media, television video games, and certain phone use.
- Make a brief pilgrimage to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Lansing.
 While there, participate in the Holy Mass, a celebration of the Word of God, Liturgy of the Hours, Way of the Cross, Rosary, or a penitential celebration that ends in the individual confessions.

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once per day, and may be applied either to oneself or a soul in purgatory.

What is the Prayer Tree?

To the members of our parish:

The presence of children is a gift to the church, and they are a reminder that our parish is growing. The way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to the church, to God, and to one another. Help them learn liturgical behavior by praying, singing, and responding. Let them know that they are at home in his house of worship. (And give a smile of encouragement to their parents.)

week that you want, and the Chalice as well as suggested prayers are yours for that week.


