

DEACON ERIC'S MIND)

Story Time—600

‘Oh, somewhere in this favoured land the sun is shining bright, The band is playing somewhere, and somewhere hearts are light; And somewhere men are laughing, and somewhere children shout, But there is no joy in Mudville—mighty Casey has struck out.’

(Ernest Lawrence Taylor)

That is the paragraph with which I ended the 500th installment of “We Are All Evangelizers” in January of 2024 and it seemed appropriate to lead today’s 600th installment with the same excerpt from the classic poem “Casey at the Bat.” It just so happens that I deemed the closing lines from “Casey” appropriate in 2024 because the sentiments of emptiness felt by Mudville fans (though in the context of the sport of baseball) mirrored those of Detroit Lions fans whose football season had just ended shy of the Super Bowl. Once again, here in 2026, we saw the Lions season end yesterday one win short of the playoffs.

But a second reason I brought up the poem was because it is a great

example of story-telling, and that’s really my focus today. There’s a wonderful column in this month’s “Liguorian” magazine entitled “The Power of Story.” Here’s what author Vinita Hampton Wright states in the opening paragraph:

I love that the sacred book of Christianity is full of stories... the bible is a marvelous collection of stories, told by historians and prophets, poets and evangelists. And we have stories within stories, such as when Jesus shares parables.

If we think of the most interesting people in our lives, we will find that most of them are good story-tellers. That doesn’t make them great people, of course, but whether we are going to a party or a medical conference, we will find we remember more when someone is able to communicate via a story. Wright tells us that “storytelling is simple enough to hold the attention of small children, yet this sort of learning can also be an effective and sophisticated process of human development.”

Wright also says that we remember grand plots of novels and people of literature more than historical facts, saying: “Stories are facts arranged meaningfully. Without a plot, actions have little meaning. Without a motive, a character is unconvinc-

ing.” Wright’s article is part of several in this month’s issue of “Liguorian” encouraging Catholics to read more about the faith, about saints, about Scripture saying: “the Holy Spirit is still writing stories, even though the biblical canon is closed.” (No more books can be added to the bible.)

“Please, Wright writes, “allow yourself to enjoy stories. Find new ones and rediscover the old ones. Allow your spirit to learn wisdom and hope with the delight of a child.”

So now installment 600 of “We Are All Evangelizers” is winding down and I’m thinking how different so many of the stories I’ve written have been. Some have been stories about my life, others have been about people of the parish. Some have been attempts at humor, some more poignant. I hope, though not all are masterpieces, that at least, they contained something interesting. In the end I think, they are like Forrest Gump’s chocolates: “You never know what you’re going to get.”


YOUTH GROUP NEWS:

Epiphany House Blessing

"Chalking the door" is a centuries-old custom in which Christians gather on the feast of Epiphany (January 6) to ask God's blessing on their home. A traditional way of doing this is to take a piece of blessed chalk and inscribe the following above the entrance door at the home:

20 + C + M + B + 26

The "20" and the "26" refer to the year. The "+" between the letters symbolizes the cross of Christ. The "C M B" initials have two meanings:

1. The initials represent the three Magi: Casper, Melchior and Balthazar.
2. The initials are an abbreviation for the Latin "Christus mansionem benedict" (May Christ bless this house)

Be sure to pick up your Home Blessing Kit near the church entrance which includes a piece of blessed chalk and instructions.



Miscellaneous Money Matters

IRA Required Minimum Distributions: If you're 73 years or older, donating your IRA required minimum distribution to the parish can be a way to pay less taxes. Contact your investment advisor and the parish office to make a direct transfer so that the distribution doesn't have to be claimed as income.

Donate stocks, bonds, or mutual funds: To avoid capital gains tax on appreciated securities, consider transferring them to St. Joe's as your donation. Contact your investment advisor and the parish office to make this transfer.

- It allows us to seek your input and feedback.
- It allows you to formally support the parish financially, since envelopes will be issued to you for your use.
- We can start a sacramental record for you.
- Finally, registering can also help you have a greater sense of belonging to and ownership of the parish.

Please note:

The envelopes you receive when registering will now play an important role in the reception of the sacraments. (i.e. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation and Marriage along with Godparent and Confirmation Sponsor selection) in the parish. We're asking all parishioners to get into the habit of using your envelopes in the weekly collection. Even if you give online or don't have anything to put in the envelope, please submit an empty envelope. It will help us know how many registered parishioners attend a given Mass and it will also come in handy for determining if a person, presenting themselves for a sacrament, is attending Mass regularly as is required.
