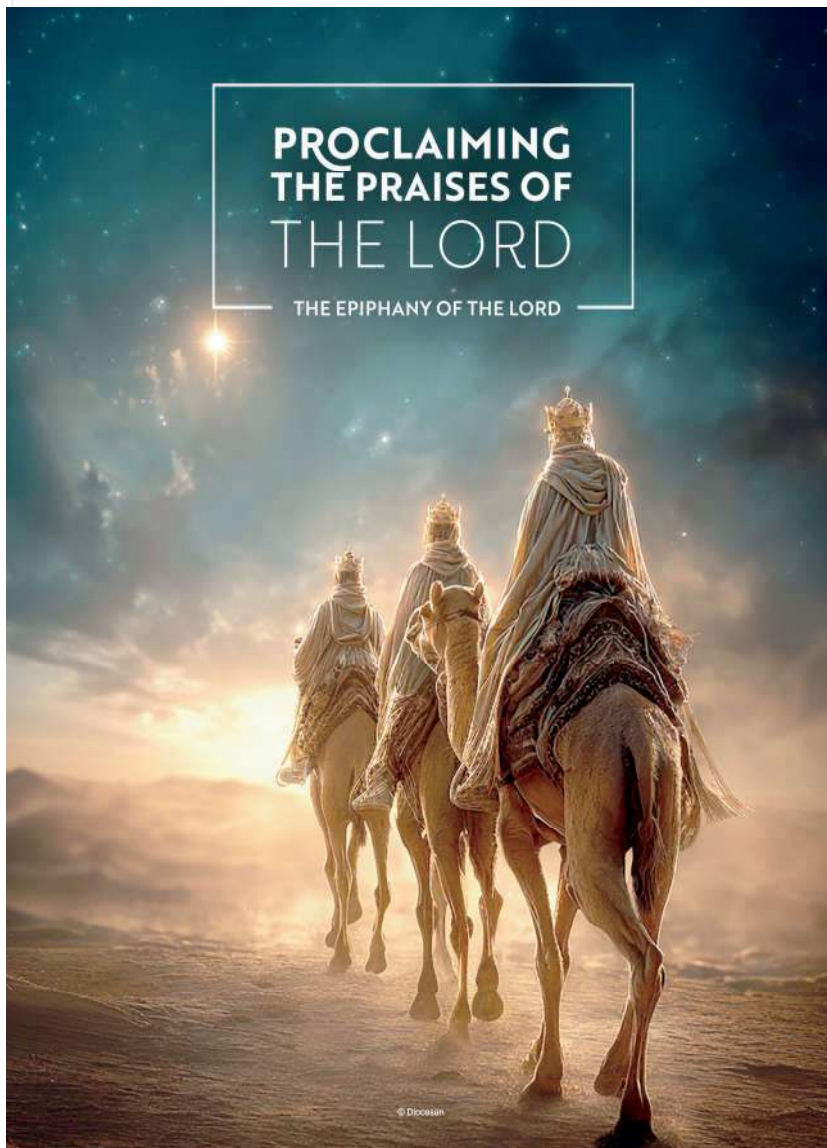

Epiphany House Blessing

"Chalking the door" is a centuries-old custom in which Christians gather on the feast of Epiphany (January 6) to ask God's blessing on their home. A traditional way of doing this is to take a piece of blessed chalk and inscribe the following above the entrance door at the home:

20 + C + M + B + 26

The "20" and the "26" refer to the year. The "+" between the letters symbolizes the cross of Christ. The "C M B" initials have two meanings:

1. The initials represent the three Magi: Casper, Melchior and Balthazar.
2. The initials are an abbreviation for the Latin "Christus mansionem benedict" (May Christ bless this house)

Be sure to pick up your Home Blessing Kit near the church entrance which includes a piece of blessed chalk and instructions.

Nobody's Going to Read This 2.0

"Nobody's going to read this" I said to myself as I prepared to write this column. It's being written early to meet one of the several early deadlines that go with the Christmas season. On top of scrambling for new column ideas, I think I've used up my allotment of "grins" for 2025.

"Nobody's going to read this—this is the bulletin on the Sunday following New Year's," I said to myself. "Nobody's going to spend time reading the bulletin today after having to go to Mass five times over a two-week period. Enough is enough already." And besides, I think I've used up my allotment of poignant thoughts for 2025.

"Nobody's going to read this, there plenty football (and holiday leftovers) still available today—it's a waste of time to read this bulletin, isn't it? How many read the Sunday bulletin anytime?" I wondered. And as I write this, I have a nagging feeling that I'm not only out of grins and poignan-

cy, I may be completely out of words for the year and I haven't yet received my allotment for 2026. And really, who wants to read a column that runs out of words?

If anything in the first three paragraphs sounds familiar, that's good news for me because, despite it's premise, it means someone did read my last column for 2024. The first three paragraphs have been reworked to some degree, but carry the same theme. If it weren't for the Holy Spirit feeding me good material we would have a big hole on page three of our Sunday bulletin each week.

The irony of the title of the column is that it was probably the one that drew the most positive feedback of anything I've written in the past 12 months, so I will use the closing story I used at this time last year. It is a look at a famous poem written by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. Now I have never been accused of being a long or tall fellow myself, but his "Christmas Bells" has all the markings of an Old Testament psalm, with a variety of emotions expressed. That might work.

The first three verses all end with

the uplifting line "Of peace on earth, good will to men." But then his thoughts turn to the reality of his time, the American Civil War, with bombs bursting and people dying and Longfellow's thoughts turn dark:

"There is no peace on earth' he said, 'for hate is strong and mocks the song of 'peace on earth good will to men.'" But then he hears Christmas bells ring once again and his faith in God appears in the final verse: "God is not dead, nor doth He sleep; The Wrong shall fail, the Right prevail, With peace on earth, good-will to men."

"Maybe one person will read this and find the words of this Longfellow fellow pertinent to their lives. I'll pray for that person" I said to myself, as I smile in thanks to the Holy Spirit.

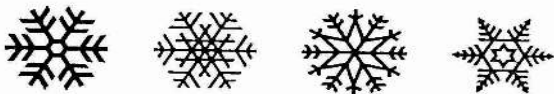
YOUTH GROUP NEWS:
