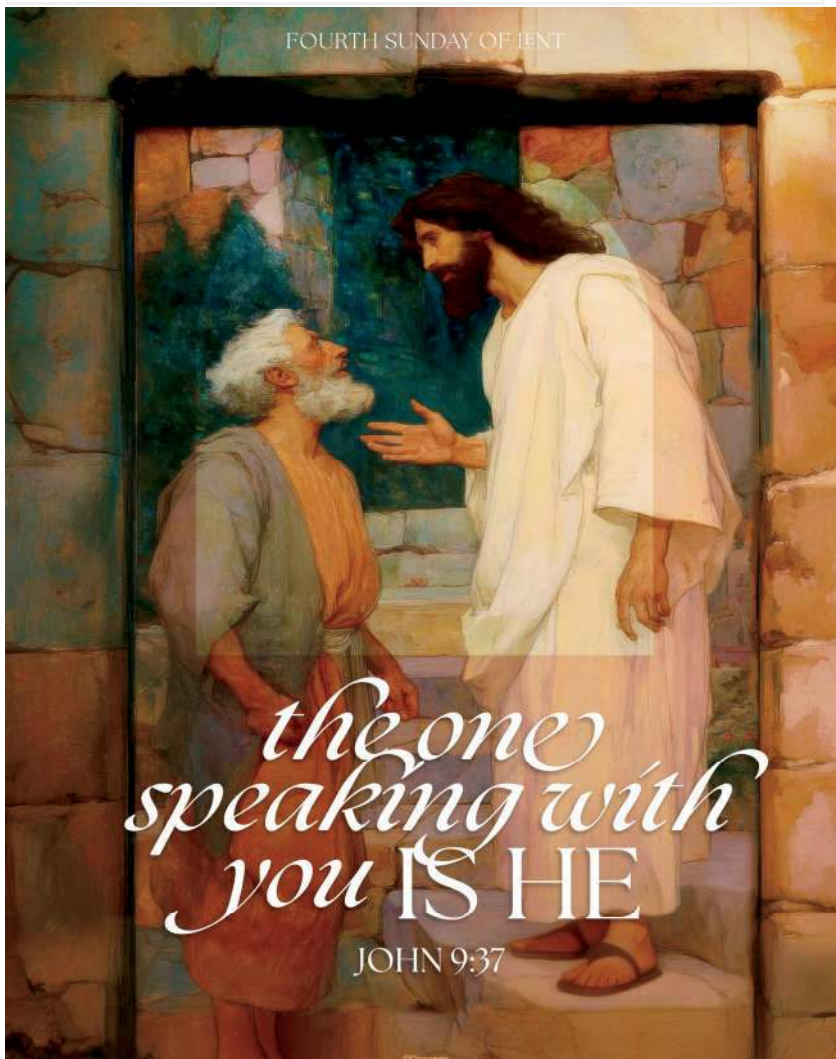

Baseball Has Been Very, Very Good to Me

I have no claims to originality in the title today. "Baseball has been very, very good to me" is something of an iconic phrase not only in comedy circles, but in and around baseball diamonds as well. It is a phrase first proclaimed by comedian Garrett Morris on "Saturday Night Live" in 1978, who, in the character of Chico Esquela, proclaimed the happiness and joy of playing a child's game as an adult, and actually getting paid for it. The phrase was usually part of a skit of a sports report on SNL and it was one that caught on around the country. (There's even a trivia team in the St Johns area that reportedly uses the phrase regularly when a baseball-related question pops up. No info available on how often that team gets baseball questions correct.)

The quote is relevant today because I just got back from Florida, where some high school friends and I have been meeting since 2019 to watch the Detroit Tigers in a couple spring

training games. Baseball brings us together and we share baseball memories of Tiger teams of the past, such as the Tigers 1968 world championship team, the only world championship of our youth. We also share memories of the 1984 team, the only world championship of our adult lives. At some point each year, one of the five of us, will utter the phrase "Baseball has been very, very good to me." The joy expressed by the fictional character Chico Esquela, is a joy we feel, knowing that our love for the game is a glue that keeps us together and keeps us coming back to central Florida each March.

I can also say that baseball has been very, very good to me due to my memories of going to Tiger games as a child. After my older brother and sisters got married and moved out of the house, my Dad had time to take me (and a couple years later, my younger brother) to a couple Tiger games a year. In the bleachers of the old Tiger Stadium, we would talk about the game and eat hot dogs. Part of baseball's charm is that it moves at a pace that allows people to hold a conversation and still keep track of what's going on. It was what I learned later in life to be what is now called "quality

time"—important time with him, who lived a very busy life as a business owner. He didn't have as much time with his children as he may have desired, but it was time had at the ballpark that allowed for the ever-important one-on-one time a child needs.

As we age, we often reflect on the happy times of our youth. I used to play pick-up baseball virtually every summer day. I used to pore over the baseball stats in the newspaper every day. Games weren't on TV on a daily basis, so a rare Tiger game on the Saturday Game of the Week was like gold – but it still didn't carry the value of three hours with Dad, munching on a hot dog smothered in mustard on a warm weekday night in the bleachers.

Baseball has been very, very good to me.

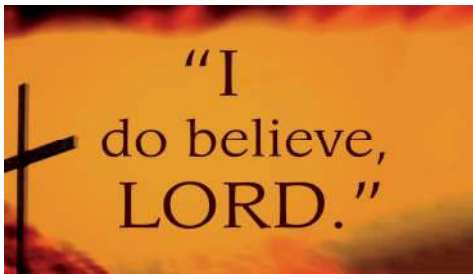

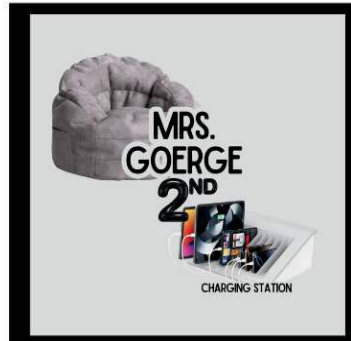
