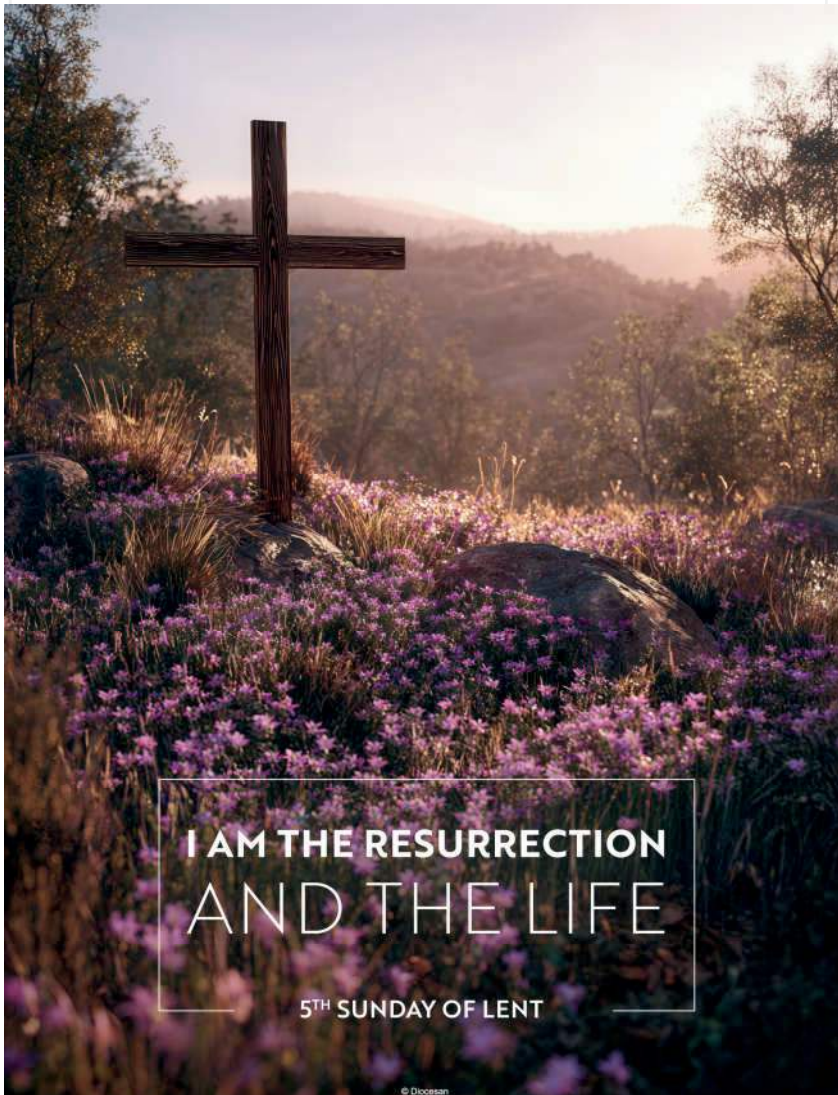

The Lazarus Story

Today's well-known Gospel story can be delivered in a short form or long form. (The cynic who glances at his watch every ten minutes at Mass might say that there is a long form and a really long form, but most importantly it's a beautifully-written part of John's gospel.) Saying it's a part of John's gospel, however, doesn't really do it justice. Though, it is a true story and not a parable, John presents it almost as if he were a playwright and not an evangelist.

Taking it in its extended version, we see how it's really divided into six scenes, or acts. In the first scene, we are introduced to the characters, Jesus, Mary, Martha and Lazarus. We're told by John that Mary is the woman who had anointed Jesus with expensive oil and dried his feet with her hair. Lazarus was her brother and he was ill. When Jesus was told of Lazarus' illness, he proclaimed that the illness would not end in death but is for the "glory of God."

John's second scene gives us Jesus continuing his preaching for two days before informing his disciples that he was going to see his sick friend in Bethany – which is not far from Jerusalem in Judea, but a long way from where he was preaching. This startled the disciples because Jesus had recently left Judea, as mobs threatened to stone him. Jesus says "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him."

Our third act has Jesus arriving in Bethany, but by that time, John tells us that Lazarus had been in his tomb for four days. Martha rushes out to the countryside when she hears that Jesus is coming and believes Jesus when he tells her that Lazarus will rise, telling her "I am the resurrection and the life, whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live."

The next scene plays out in a similar fashion when Mary comes out to meet Jesus. She fell down to her knees in front of Jesus lamenting the loss of Lazarus. Jesus became deeply troubled and he joined Mary in her tears. ("He wept," is the shortest sentence in Scripture.)

In act five, John presents the reader with

the details of Lazarus being called out of the tomb by Jesus. Lazarus staggers out of the tomb, still bound in burial cloths "his face wrapped in a cloth."

(This was an extremely touching scene as presented in the TV series "The Chosen.") Finally, the six-act story of the raising of Lazarus concludes with the acknowledgment that even some doubters among the Jews came around to understand. In John's words: "Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him."

What John doesn't tell us here is that this would trigger actions by Jewish officials that would result in Jesus' crucifixion. Stay tuned, the "Jesus Story" has a ways to go.

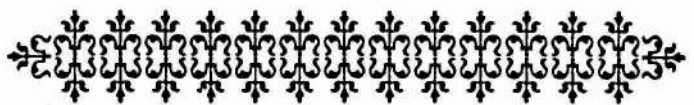

Things Every Catholic Should Know:

Question: What is the term for the Pope's teaching authority?

Answer: Magisterium. The Magisterium refers to the authority of the Pope and Bishops to teach on matters of Faith and Morals. The word "magisterium" is derived from the Latin word "magister," which means "teacher." In ecclesiastical Latin, it refers to the office or authority of a teacher, particularly in the context of the Catholic Church's teaching authority.

Which council affirmed the doctrine of Papal Infallibility?

Answer: The First Vatican Council. The First Vatican Council was held in 1869-1870 and defined the dogma on Papal Infallibility, namely, that the Pope is free of error when speaking "Ex Cathedra" (from the chair) only on matters of Faith and Morals.

What would you risk for your faith? Less than 100 years ago in Mexico, Catholics were forced to answer that question. When the government closed churches and hunted priests, ordinary Catholics stepped forward to defend their freedom to live the faith.

This is a great opportunity for families to prepare for their Easter celebration. Holy Week is long with waiting and watching. Putting together this basket gives kids (of all ages) a wonderful way to spend some time on Saturday morning preparing for our Easter Celebration.

We will gather around at the front of the altar to have this blessing. The tradition of this Easter Basket of blessed foods is shared at Easter morning breakfast. Be sure to include some Easter candy in the basket that will be the first Easter candy eaten. Some items to include may be:

- BREAD** which symbolizes our Lord himself, who is the Living Bread, come down from heaven to give eternal life.
- MEAT** (ham, sausage) which ends our time of fasting and waiting.
- EGGS** symbolize new life and resurrection.
- SALT** reminds us of our Christian duty to others.
- CHEESE** symbolizes the moderation that Christians should have in all things.
- BUTTER** molded in the shape of a Lamb reminds us of the goodness of Christ that we should have towards all things.
- CANDLE** which reminds us of the light of Christ and can be used during the Easter season.
- FLOWERS** for the joy of spring and new life.

**Helping Neighbors in Need
Four Wheels at a time!**

St Vincent DePaul (Diocese of Lansing) has expanded its Car Ministry to include donated vehicles! In the first two years of this ministry, we have assisted 84 Neighbors in Need (NIN) into automobiles. This form of transportation affords them freer access to the workplace, grocery store, medical care, schooling, and so much more! This effort continues, with your help, to help our neighbors out of Systemic Poverty that lack of mobility can perpetuate.

When a NIN is identified, a home visit by two Vincentians is made to discuss their transportation challenges as well as to verify that they will be able to afford insurance, gas and the vehicle upkeep expenses. Additionally, a payment of \$1,500.00 as a co-pay is all they need to get into a vehicle.

We have 20 NIN looking for vehicles. If you can help, please call us at (517) 484-5395 ext 102. Please leave a message and someone will get back to you and explain how easy it is to donate a vehicle!



Upon donation a car, all appropriate tax documents will be provided.

St. Joseph Parish Funeral Luncheon Ministry

At St. Joseph Parish, we are blessed to be able to host funeral luncheons for parish families following their loved one's funeral Mass. This is an important opportunity for friends and extended family to support and share with our bereaved members at a hectic time.

1. You can help by working at the lunch. There are 6 teams that cover 2 months each throughout the year. On each team there is a lunch coordinator (or co-coordinators) and helpers. The time of helping out is usually mid morning to mid afternoon at the Columbian hall. There is also a helper sub list if you can help occasionally.
2. You can help by donating a salad or dessert for the luncheon; this doesn't have to be any fancy or homemade. These offerings can be dropped off the morning of the funeral luncheon. Your name would be added to the list and someone would contact you throughout the year to see if you are available.
3. You can help from home by contacting those who cook, bake & share. This caller knows how many salads or desserts are needed for the number of people expected and makes calls accordingly.

This is a quiet ministry of service that is open to everyone - young and old, men and women, families, or singles. This work is on God's schedule, not ours. Death will touch each of our families but we don't know the 'when.' We can show support and love with a time of gathering and a simple meal.

Parents with one or more students attending Lansing Catholic High School may apply for a parish subsidy grant from St. Joseph Church to help with tuition costs. There are basic requirements to apply and forms are available through the parish office or on our website: stjoecatholic.com/forms/
