St. Peter Squared

No, the title is not a misprint or typo. I do not mean St. Peter's Square. (Actually, St. Peter's Square is not a square at all, but an ellipse a.k.a. an oval. More on ellipses in my next geometry column. P.S. Don't hold your breath for that.) Anyhow, the title references our first two readings at Mass today (4-26). St. Peter is featured in each, speaking in the first one and writing in the second. (I know that means St. Peter is multiplied by two and not squared, but "St. Peter Multiplied" is not even remotely clever as a title. It's a literary license thing.)

In the recent book study group I led during Lent, I emphasized each week that we were taking the path of St. Peter, acknowledging his up and down relationship with Jesus. For example, one moment he's praised by Jesus and proclaimed "The Rock" on which his church would be built and the next minute he's told by the Lord "Get behind me Satan." And though maybe not to that degree, it's the up-and-down route all of us are

taking to get closer to Jesus.

Sometimes, like Peter we take one step forward and two steps back. But Peter, as leader of the church after the gift of the Holy Spirit came down on the apostles, was constantly moving forward, and that should be our goal as well. Today's reading from Acts is the end of his great speech on Pentecost Sunday in which he puts the pieces together, so to speak, in identifying Jesus as Lord and Christ, as divine and the true Messiah. He exclaimed to them "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation" through repentance and the sacrament of baptism. Three thousand were baptized that day. As I pointed out in my homily last week, every generation can be identified as corrupt.

In our second reading from the First Letter of Peter we get less of an enthusiastic and Holy-Spirit-driven group of listeners than we witnessed in the Acts reading. It is somewhat academic in nature, which reflects the period of time that has passed since the first Pentecost. The Church was just starting to take shape at Pentecost, but Peter's letter came 30 years or so later and the Church, though still young in one sense, was at least getting established around the eastern Mediterra-

nean Sea. A generation of Christians were now practicing the faith, but removed from the direct presence of Jesus, Peter and other disciples had to re-emphasize Jesus teachings.

Today's selection has Peter reminding these disciples in the Church of some of Jesus attributes that we need to work on. Specifically, how we need to be patient in our suffering, noting how Christ suffered for us – with his death and Resurrection opening the gates of heaven for us. By patient suffering in his name we will receive plentiful grace in return. St. Peter lived what he preached, bearing patient suffering a year or two after this letter was written. His leadership as our first pope, is why he is recognized by the Church across the world, but nowhere more than in Rome, in St. Peter's Basilica and St. Peter's Square.

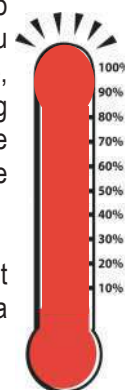

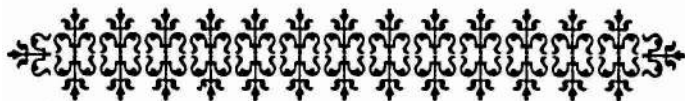

**Having a Child Baptized?
Receive First Communion? Or Confirmed?**

Requirements for Parents:

The priest must have a "well-founded hope" the child will be raised in the "practice" of the Faith.

Therefore, parents must:

- Be Registered in the Parish
- Attend Mass every Sunday
- Use their collection envelopes (even if empty) each time they go to Mass
- Be married in the church (otherwise they cannot receive communion when they come to church and therefore cannot fully practice or model the Faith for their child)

Canon. 868 1.2*there must be a founded hope that the infant child will be brought up in the Catholic religion; if such hope is altogether lacking, the baptism is to be delayed according to the prescripts of particular law after the parents have been advised about the reason.*

Requirements of Godparents for Baptisms

- Be appointed by the parents
- Have completed the sixteenth year of age
- Be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has already received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and who leads a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken (i.e. Attends Mass every Sunday)
- Not be bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared; (i.e. is married in the church, a person who serves as a visible role model for the person receiving the sacrament)
- Not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.

Canon. 874.1 *To be permitted to take on the function of sponsor of a person*

Things Every Catholic Should Know:

Are Catholics taught that they are the only ones who will go to heaven?

Answer: No. The Catholic Church does teach that outside the Catholic Church there is no salvation, but one must look at what this really means. Paragraph 3 of the Second Vatican Council's Decree on Ecumenism (Unitatis Redintegratio, 21 November 1964) says that our separated brethren who believe in the faith of Christ and have been properly baptized are put in some, though imperfect, communion with the Catholic Church. It also says that those who have been justified by faith in baptism are incorporated into Christ, they therefore have a right to be called Christians, and with good reason are accepted as brothers by the children of the Catholic Church. Everyone is saved through the Catholic Church, either as faithful members of that Church, or as members of churches which contain some significant elements of truth and sanctification found in the Catholic Church, or as persons who, through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ or His Church, but who nevertheless seek God with a sincere heart and, moved by grace, try in their actions to do His Will as they know it through the dictates of their conscience. For this reason, a bishop is responsible for every soul within his diocese, not just the Catholic ones.
