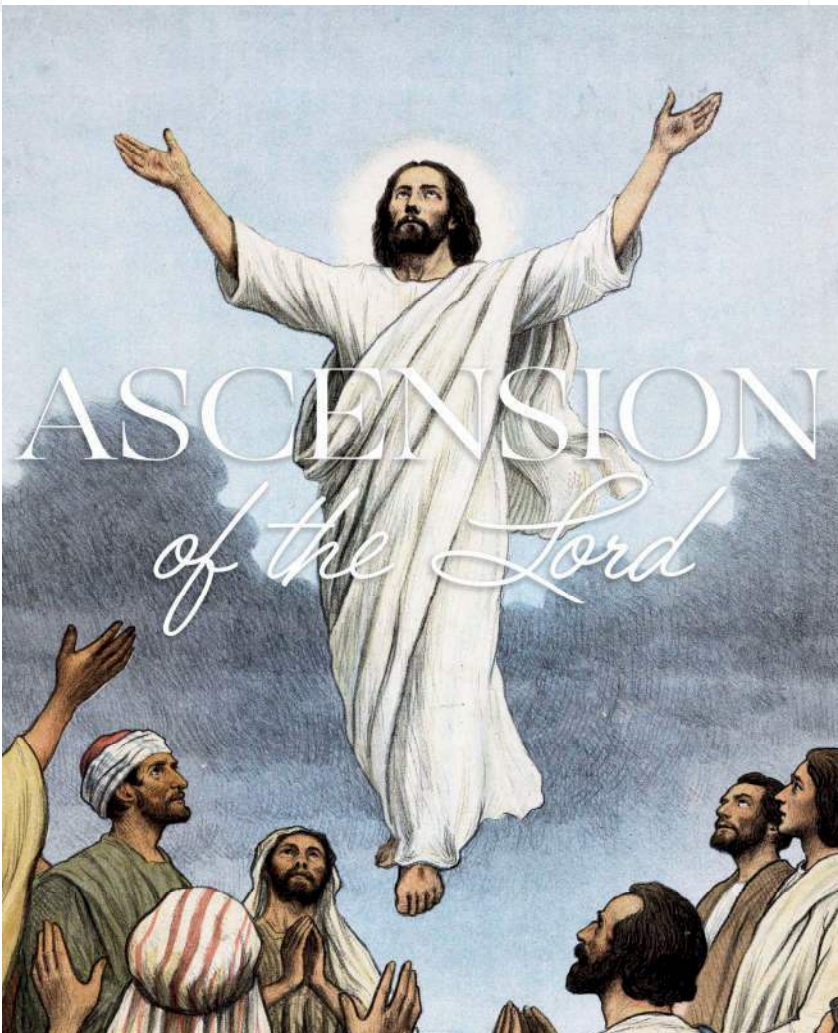

Knock, Knock...

A child's first introduction to learning the art of joke-telling is often through the template of the Knock-Knock joke. One of the most common introductory jokes is this fruit-based one:

"Knock-knock. (A) Who's there?
Banana. (A) Banana who?
Knock-knock. (A) Who's there?
Banana. (A) Banana who?
Knock-knock. (A) Who's there?
Orange. (A) Orange you glad I didn't say banana?"

As adults, who have heard (and probably told) this joke dozens of times. We play along and laugh loudly for the child's sake as if we had never heard the joke. And we go on with our lives.

A couple of days ago I was going for a walk in my St. Johns neighborhood before dinner. It was unusually quiet for that time of day when I heard a knock, knock. Actually, what I heard was a "knock, knock, knock... innumerable times. I could not count

them because I knew it was a woodpecker's peck I was hearing and they peck 15 to 20 times a second. I stopped and listened, unsure of exactly where it was. The pecking would go for about 8 to 10 seconds then stop. Then start up once again.

I was nearing a corner in a residential neighborhood and looked around to see if I could identify where the sound was originating. I first thought it was coming from the telephone pole kitty-corner from where I stood. I took about five steps and realized that the sound was coming from behind me. I spotted the bird and watched for about a minute as it went through a series of pecks offset by periods of silence, then it flew away into the distance.

And as I walked away, I thought to myself that there's probably some religious overtones to this simple observation of nature. I thought about listening to the pecking sounds in relation to trying to listen to Jesus when he's talking to us. Then I thought, what if there were another nearby woodpecker who started pecking in response? Would I have been able to distinguish where either of the woodpeckers were? What if a third woodpecker chimed in?

What if all those sounds would then represent all of the other voices we hear in life amidst all of the other noises in our world? What if all those voices would then interfere with our ability to hear Jesus clearly? How could we then know what God's plans were for us? Lots of questions and no definitive answers amidst the noise we allow into our lives. We can actually eliminate much of that noise, by setting aside a quiet room in our home or sliding into a quiet pew at church on a weekday afternoon.

I think again about that single woodpecker who was pecking away almost directly above me when I first heard it. What if that were God pecking away at my hard head?

Our weekly average since July 1, 2025 is \$24,101.55. If we continue to keep this average, we will meet our budgeted goal.

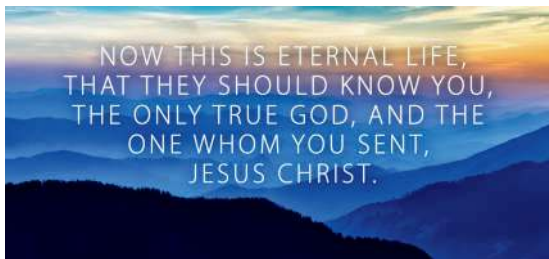
Why is it so important to register in a Parish?

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times young adults who have moved away for years or are still living with their parents think they are still signed up under their parent's registration. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish.

We encourage and invite all adult members of our faith community (18 years or older) to register.

Registration shows you belong. *Being a registered parishioner makes the process much easier when it is time for infant baptisms, weddings, and when asked to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation.* Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

To register at St. Joseph Church, you can stop by the parish office for a registration form or go to our website <https://www.stjoecatholic.com/forms>, fill out the registration form and either email, mail or drop it off in the collection basket at Mass.

Things Every Catholic Should Know:

What must a person do (and believe) to be considered a Catholic by the Church?

Answer: First, they must be baptized. Second, they must accept the 10 Commandments as the model for their life. Third, they must subscribe to the beliefs expressed in the Apostles' Creed (or Nicene Creed). Finally, they must accept the dogmatic statements issued by the ecumenical councils and the popes as true and binding upon their faith. Obviously, all this doesn't happen all at once when an infant is baptized, but this is what is expected of an adult believer, whether they are a convert or a cradle Catholic.
