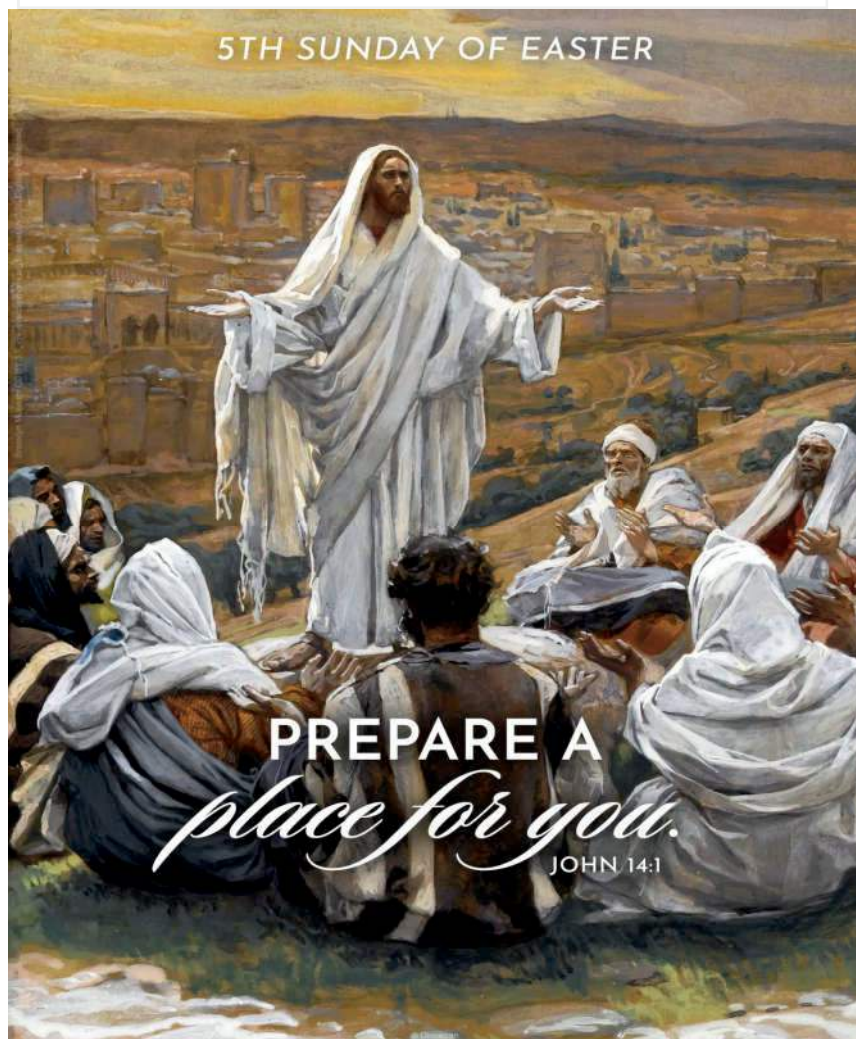

FIRST COMMUNION

Here we are at the beginning of the month of May and there's just a little over a month left in the school year. May is also Mary's month, with May crowning right around the corner. Of course, Mother's Day is only a week away. We are having a wonderful pot-luck dinner remembering "The Cristeros" followed by a presentation by the ever entertaining and informative Catholic history author Phillip Campbell.

This year we will also celebrate not only Pentecost, but Most Holy Trinity in May. And let's not forget the graduation of our St. Joe high school seniors. To conclude the month, we have the unofficial start of summer – a day off for students and most working adults. Finally, we haven't forgotten the event of the year for our second-graders, who are receiving the Holy Eucharist for the very first time at Masses this weekend.

Fr. Dwight Ezop has a wonderful article in May's issue of Faith magazine which hit parish mailboxes this

week and I'd like to devote some of my column to Fr. Dwight's reflections on First Communions. Fr. Dwight had this reaction to those who were receiving the Eucharist at his parish this past Easter Vigil:

As they came forward to receive the Precious Body and the Precious Blood, they each had looks of such anticipation on their faces. In consuming the Eucharist, those looks transformed to what I would characterize as looks of bliss and peace. I pray they will always have such looks on their faces—anticipation, joy and peace.

Fr. Dwight also reflects in his column on a story from the first year of his priesthood:

"One of the first communicants in my line at the time of the sharing of communion stepped forward, hands held high, just as he had been taught. As I placed the Body of Christ in his hands, he replied with a heartfelt "Amen." He carefully took the host in his hand, held it up, and said in the best stage whisper I've ever heard, 'I've got Him!' The young boy's earnest smile matched the excitement in his voice....To this day, I think it was only by the grace of God that I didn't fall over."

The actions of these children are not uncommon. They have been studying and practicing since the start of the school year—learning about and yearning for the Eucharist. In contrast, I see many a person of all ages who could use a reminder about the process of receiving the Precious Body and Precious Blood.

When the ministers of the Eucharist present the host or cup, the response should be "Amen," which means "I do believe that I am receiving Jesus Christ, body and blood, soul and divinity." But there are a significant number of people who seemed to have forgotten that, so maybe the youngsters could be a reminder.

So let's congratulate the First Communicants we see this weekend at St. Joe's and let's try to imitate their joy and their reverence going forward.

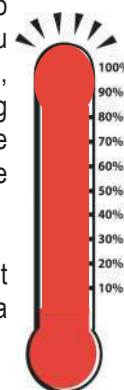

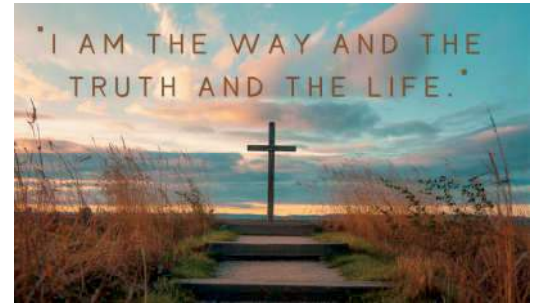

The Council of Trent was called to respond to which major historical event?

Answer: The Protestant Reformation.

The Council of Trent was convened in 1545 to respond to the Protestant Reformation, which had, by the time the council was convened, fractured the unity of Christendom. Violent holy wars had taken place in various nations throughout Europe, and the traditional teachings of the Church were challenged both within the Church and outside of it.

Having a Child Baptized?

Receive First Communion? Or Confirmed?

Requirements for Parents:

The priest must have a "well-founded hope" the child will be raised in the "practice" of the Faith.

Therefore, parents must:

- Be Registered in the Parish
- Attend Mass every Sunday
- Use their collection envelopes (even if empty) each time they go to Mass
- Be married in the church (otherwise they cannot receive communion when they come to church and therefore cannot fully practice or model the Faith for their child)

Canon. 868 1.2/there must be a founded hope that the infant child will be brought up in the Catholic religion; if such hope is altogether lacking, the baptism is to be delayed according to the prescripts of particular law after the parents have been advised about the reason.

Requirements of Godparents for Baptisms

- Be appointed by the parents
- Have completed the sixteenth year of age
- Be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has already received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and who leads a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken (i.e. Attends Mass every Sunday)
- Not be bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared; (i.e. is married in the church, a person who serves as a visible role model for the person receiving the sacrament)
- Not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.

Canon. 874.1 To be permitted to take on the function of sponsor of a person

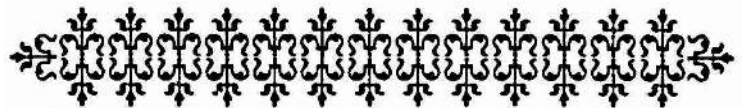


