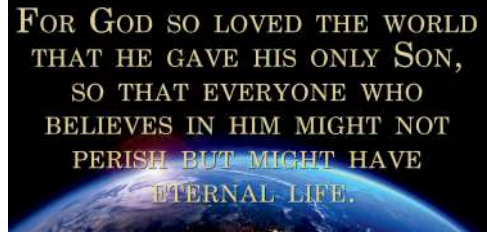

'Magnifica humanitas'

The full title of Pope Leo XIV's encyclical released today, Monday, May, 25, 2026 actually is "Magnifica humanitas: On Safeguarding the Human Person in the Time of Artificial Intelligence." Since it just came out today, I've had only time to read excerpts of the Pope's first major encyclical, so take today's column as a sample of what this literary work presents and not a professional analysis.

But I'm focusing on the encyclical today as a stimulus for those who have both a concern for basic human dignity and the possible abuse of A-I down the road. The document is quite long and will primarily be read by church leaders, theology students and journalists. But there likely will be quality summaries written and available to the public.

I would urge everyone between the ages of 18 and 50 to read a reliable summary, if not the document as a whole. Much of your future is

going to be determined to some extent by A-I. The next 20 years of Artificial Intelligence growth will be determined by whether it's subject to some sort of regulation or not. It will most certainly affect the job market. Grand Rapids-based insurance broker Acrisure, for example, just announced a job cut of over two thousand workers that they directly attributed to the growth of A-I.

"Humanity, created by God in all its grandeur, is today facing a pivotal choice: either to construct a new Tower of Babel or to build the city in which God and humanity dwell together." These are the words Pope Leo uses to open the encyclical, as he draws a parallel between the well-known biblical story of the Tower of Babel and the need for today's world to avoid letting the power of A-I be in the hands of just one or two entities.

The Babel story, of course, was an example of the sinful pride humans take in our own accomplishments apart from God. The Lord then confused the language of all the workers so they could not continue building their tower to reach into the sky. By confusing their speech and scattering them all over the earth, the pope says the story is a

warning against a plan that "dominates and ultimately dehumanizes." We can see in our current world situation how a monopoly on A-I technology for a singular world leader could create a serious problem for people across the world.

Pope Leo XIV is following in the footsteps of his namesake Pope Leo XIII who wrote the initial encyclical on human dignity and the worker, "Rerum Novarum," in 1891. That was written in response to the inhumane working conditions for many workers during the Industrial Revolution. Pope Leo XIV sees A-I as part of a Technological Revolution in which not only the worker, but mankind as a whole, must be sheltered from the misuse of power or its consolidation within a single entity.

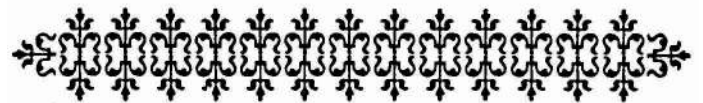

**Things Every Catholic Should Know:
 When was mandatory confession started, and who did it?**

Answer: Where James 5:14-15 was discussed, Confession has been mandatory since Jesus instituted the Sacrament. In fact, in the early Church, sins were confessed to the presbyter (priest/bishop/elder) in front of the entire congregation. It wasn't until around the 5th century that private, rather than public, confession became the norm. The Fourth Lateran Council (1215) ordered annual reception of Penance and the Eucharist. The Council of Trent (1545-1563) required confession of the kind and number of sins.
